Welcome to the 17th ANNUAL CALLERLAB CONVENTION! With your active and enthusiastic participation, this will be another outstanding convention! Whether you are a first-time attendee or a caller who has attended each convention since our start 17 years ago, you are encouraged to offer your views and opinions. Remember, CALLERLAB IS YOU!

1990 CONVENTION THEME - "BUILDING THE FOUNDATION"

This year's theme, "BUILDING THE FOUNDATION", has a dual-meaning. The strongest foundation is built like a pyramid -- the base being much larger than the top. It is important for CALLERLAB to continue to strengthen our foundation -- our teaching and recruiting skills must be improved to promote strong growth of the Square Dance Activity. "BUILDING THE FOUNDATION" also relates itself well to the CALLERLAB FOUNDATION FOR THE PRESERVATION AND PROMOTION OF SQUARE DANCING. It is of equal importance to find monies to assist in promoting the Square Dance Activity. Just as recruitment is the base for the Square Dance Activity, so, too, is fund raising the base for promoting Square Dancing around the world!

SMOKING POLICY

CONVENTION VOTING PROCEDURES

General convention voting policy: Everyone is entitled to vote in straw ballots. Only full members (not Apprentices) may participate in a formal ballot. (Note: Those Subscribers attending become full members upon arrival and are eligible to vote in all balloting procedures.)

Committee meeting voting policy: Again, everyone is entitled to vote in straw ballots. Only those who were committee members thirty (30) days prior to the convention are eligible to vote in formal ballots. (Committee chairmen are provided with a listing identifying those eligible to vote if you have a question.) While this may seem arbitrary, it is to avoid negating the work of the committee during the preceding year.

Mail balloting: Ballots for the Wednesday morning general meeting agenda will be sent to all those members who were unable to attend here in Orlando! If 2/3's of those not attending the convention vote disagreement on any item within thirty (30) days, that item must be scheduled for discussion at the next scheduled convention.

All Committee Chairmen are reminded to have a written report of their actions to the Executive Secretary no later than April 23, 1990 for the next issue of DIRECTION.

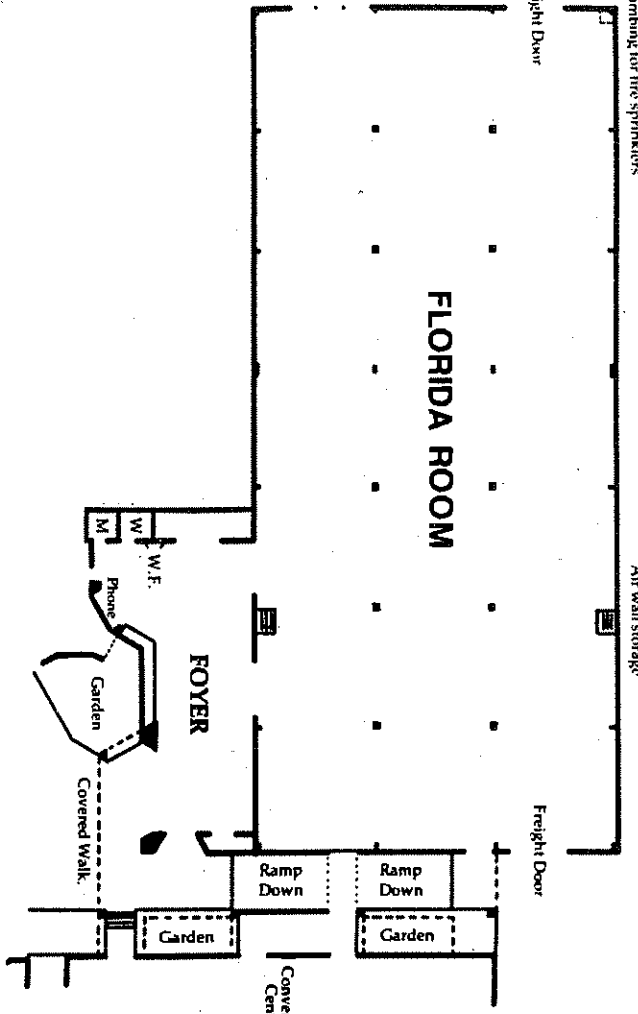
