Please tell the chairman you are interested and would like to join his committee. Even if you don't find a committee that interests you, there are other events that should stir interest. Both on Monday and Tuesday afternoons, we have open sessions for those of you not on committees or not desiring to be on one.

We mentioned in the March Direction that your tape recorders would be welcomed at all sessions. However, we will also be providing a complete convention wrap-up in the June issue of Direction. After the convention is over though, our work does not cease nor do your responsibilities. What we do here at the convention is only a part of the professional responsibility that we used as a theme last year. man Mayo talked about our Professional Responsibility in his talk last year. year the theme is "YOU ARE CALLERLAB". Obviously those three words can be read or said with different inflections and written with different punctuation. But, no matter how you say it YOU ARE CALLERLAB. What we resolve here, how we implement our actions after we return to our home areas all are a part of this theme. In the past, we have had some callers who say they believe in what CALLERLAB is doing but the support is only lip service to the projects. The term Mainstream is a classic case in point - Many callers agree the idea of Mainstream is good but turn right around and call all sorts of figures and terms not contained in the Mainstream list as defined. Please, if you don't agree with what is going on, say so here and lets work towards a majority opinion - but- please do not undermine the strength of CALLERLAB by undoing our efforts after you leave this convention.

This year the major topic for discussion is the question "Should CALLERLAB Support The National Square Dance Convention?" The topic will be introduced on Monday night and will be continued in smaller groups on Tuesday afternoon. It should be a spirited discussion topic - much controversy will erupt - and then emotionalism will subside and we will thoroughly examine and try to come up with a consensus of our membership. One aspect should not influence your decision or position - we are not dependent on the National Square Dance Convention for financial solvency. Your Board of Governors, in conjunction with the Ways and Means Committee, have come up with a realistic budget and dues structure that enable us to operate in the black regardless of any position we may take with the National Square Dance Convention.

WAYS AND MEANS This term frequently means budget matters. However, in CALLERLAB, it is more than just budget items. Last year, the raffle idea was hatched here. Also suggestions were made to hold fund raising dances during CALLERLAB week and seek donations from organizations. Based upon the feedback we got from our members, we are not going to repeat the raffle. It helped us this year. Our dues of \$40.00 plus the earned surplus from our convention plus the income from Accreditation will keep us operating in the black. Elsewhere in this Convention special issue, you will see lists of those who have donated their time and services for the benefit of CALL-ERLAB. Special mention should again go to Jack Lasry and his group of Florida callers who held a fund raising dance which netted \$859.00 to CALLERLAB. Incidentally, Jack also was the high seller in the Caller Interest series and the Dancer Interest series. He, alone, sold more than \$500.00 worth of raffle tickets.

THE BOARD OF GOVERNORS All members of this association play an important role in the selection and election of your Board of Governors. Each year, petitions for nominations to the Board are circulated by members or their sponsor for those seeking office as a member of the Board of Governors. Our By-Laws state that anyone is eligible for the board after they have been a member of CALLERLAB for a period of three or more years except that all members at the time of Incorporation are eligible for the elections to be held in 1976,1977 and 1978. What this simply means is that all members in good standing as of the 1976 Convention are eligible for nomination to the Board. That list is available for your review in the main hallway area. If you are signing a petition for someone, please also type or print your name so that we can verify your eligibility.

For your convenience we are listing those members of the Board and the expiration dates of their term of office. For the election to be held this fall, we have six openings. Petitions will be accepted during this convention by turning them in to Convention Headquarters- Room 4.
