CHAIRMAN'S ARTICLE JOHN MARSHALL, CHAIRMAN

his being my inaugural article for *DI-RECTION* I believe it is proper for me to share with you something of my goals for CALLERLAB, my hopes for square dancing and a bit about what our organization has been doing since our convention in Los Angeles.

As many of you are aware there are 2 Mini-Labs scheduled for 2008. Each is scheduled in conjunction with the National Square Dance Conventions in Australia and Canada. In June the Australian National was held outside of Brisbane and counted more than 1,000 attendees from Australia, New Zealand, Japan, Canada and the US. They danced the CALLERLAB Mainstream. Plus and Advanced programs, and did so quite well. The Mini-Lab was held in an area named Coolangatta and included approximately 55 callers and many partners. CALLER-LAB's invited representatives were **Jerry Reed**, for the Home Office, Tim Marriner, for the Board of Governors, and myself as the current CALLERLAB Chairman. Happily each of us was able to have our wives, Del, Donna and Mary, travel with us to the Mini-Lab convention. As a point of information, the hosting Mini-Lab pays the economy airfare for each requested CALLER-LAB individual representative; in addition they pay for the couples' food and lodging convention package. The couples themselves pay all other expenses. The organizers did a fine job of running a very successful event. The panels and interest sessions were staffed by a number of very fine Australian callers along with Jerry, Tim and myself. I'm pleased to report that CALLERLAB has had its membership increased by a dozen or more active Australian and New Zealand callers. By the time you read this, the Canadian Mini-Lab and National Convention will also be over and I will fill you in on that in the next issue of DIRECTION.

he Ballot for the 2008 BOG election is enclosed with this issue of *DIREC-TION* for all voting members. Voting members who receive Electronic DIRECTION will receive their ballots via regular mail. Members eligible to vote will be electing 8 members to be seated on the Board following the 2009 CALLERLAB Convention in Kansas City, MO Board Members serve a term of three years.

Cal Campbell, Larry Cole, Robert Hurst, Chuck Jaworski, Tim Marriner, John Marshall, Jim Mayo, and Bob Poyner, will complete their current terms on the Board at the 2009 convention and are seeking reelection.

Valid petitions have been submitted for the following 9 additional candidates: Scott Byars, Barry Clasper, Trevor Day, Wade Driver, Jon Jones, Mike Olivieri, Charlie

Robertson, Justin Russell, and Jim Wass.

The results of this important election will be announced in the next issue of *DIRECTION*. Press releases will be mailed to publications and caller associations announcing the results.

POST-CONVENTION VOTE RESULT

ollowing the 2008 CALLERLAB Convention, 885 ballots were mailed to eligible voting members, asking whether or not the action taken at the 2008 CALLERLAB Convention should be rescinded (overturned). The results of the convention action were reported in the minutes of the Annual Meeting which were mailed to all members with the Flash 2008 issue of *DIRECTION*.

The bylaws specify that a minimum of one-third of the mailed ballots (this year 295) must be returned in order to constitute a quorum for mail ballots. Additionally, two-thirds of those responding must vote to rescind the vote taken at the convention or the vote will stand as taken.

The MOTIONS printed below were presented to the membership during the 2008 Annual Meeting on Wednesday, March 19, 2008. All three MOTIONS were approved by the Membership at the meeting and were submitted to the Voting Members by mail ballot. Of the 885 ballots mailed, 268 valid ballots were returned by the May 31, 2008 deadline. Therefore, the number of ballots returned is not sufficient to constitute a quorum and the votes taken at the 2008 CALLERLAB Convention stand as approved at the convention.

The following MOTIONS stand as approved by the Voting Members at the 2008 Annual Meeting of the Members:

1) BE IT RESOLVED, that the current CALLERLAB Dress Code for Members be replaced with the following: "DRESS CODE -

PROGRAM POLICY INITIATIVE RENAMED NEW INITIATIVES

proposal to support experimentation ⊾with CALLERLAB Dance Programs named the Program Policy Initiative or PPI was introduced at the 2005 CALLERLAB Convention in Louisville, KY. The basic idea of the PPI is to encourage callers, clubs, associations, and others to conduct experiments of ways to involve more people with square dancing. It must be stressed that these experiments are NOT intended to impact the current dancing community, they are intended to be a way to introduce square dancing to a large number of people. These experiments have NO limits. It is up to the imagination of those sponsoring the experiment to determine the extent of the experiment. This PPI is NOT intended as a way to provide legitimacy to any existing so-called one floor program. It is, however, intended to encourage different ways to introduce square dancing to more non-dancers.

There has been confusion about this initiative concerning what is and what is not to be considered part of this initiative. In an attempt to help clarify this situation, the name of this initiative has been changed to New Initiatives. The purpose has NOT changed. The purpose is to encourage experimentation with different approaches and methods to introduce square dancing to non-dancers. The idea is to free callers and clubs to try ANYTHING and then report the results to CALLERLAB, so we may tell others about experiments. When there are successes, we need to publicize them. There are many good and innovative ideas out there, please try what you will and let us know at CALLERLAB@aol.com.

OLD IS NEW AGAIN Jon Jones

n Kilgore, TX, near Longview, there is a square dance exhibition group by the name of "Red's Reflections." They got their name from their caller/organizer, J. D. "Red" Warrick. At one time, Red was one of the very best and most popular callers in the business. He organized the Reflections several years ago and they have performed at numerous area, state and national conventions. They usually have three squares in their group and they do all traditional calls and figures. They are very impressive.

Red passed away several years ago and their current caller is **Tim Tyl** of White Oak, TX. Red is a recent inductee into the Texas Callers Hall of Fame.

Tim and the Reflections decided to sponsor a traditional dance on May 30, 2008 to have fun and to see what attraction it would have with the area dancers. Tim was to be the MC as well as one of the callers and he solicited the services of long-time callers **Melton Luttrell** and **Jon Jones** along with **Deborah Carroll-Jones** and **Vernon Jones**. Advertisement began with the admission price of a traditional \$1 per person. There were eleven squares on the floor for the first tip. The hall

was full.

There was a lot of dancing for three hours and there were eleven squares on the floor for the last tip. Nobody left early!

All of the traditional figures and calls used during the evening were taught to the dancers as very few of them had ever heard of any of the calls. They were: Three Ladies Chain, Triple Allemande, Nine Pin, Right Hand High - Left Hand Low, Rip & Snort, Thread the Needle, Birdie In the Cage, Sally Goodin', Elbow Swing, Grand Sashay, Venus and Mars, Dip and Dive, Take A Little Peek, Texas Star, Figure Eight, DoSaDo and Cowboy Loop. Between tips, Tim would play and teach Jessie Polka, Put Your Little Foot, Schottische and Cotton Eved Joe.

The dancers participated well and seemed to have a really good time learning some the dances we used to do years ago on a regular basis. Some dancers drove more than 200 miles to attend. Most impressive was everyone had a good time and stayed for the full three hours of dancing. Maybe we need more of these dances.

WINNING WAYS

Accelerated Learning Program for Squares (ALPS) Virgil Forbes

he ALPS program that I have been using for the last several years is not original to me. It is an adaptation of a number of different concepts such as "Blast", "Blitz" and "Crash Course" that have been talked about at CALLERLAB and other caller gatherings, in recent years.

The concept: Quickly equip new dancers with enough square dance vocabulary and dance skill so that they can quickly join regular club dances.

The process: A concentrated weekend (Friday/ Saturday) that teaches the major elements of the Basic program, followed by club dances that include a workshop tip to add to their choreographic vocabulary. It doesn't really get them to Mainstream (or Plus) all that much faster. It just gets them there in the format of

regular Friday night dancing, where they learn a little bit each night. In order to have time enough for this we've added an extra forty five minutes to our normal two hour dance evening, giving us eight tips rather than six.

Supporting ideas: This process allows our new dancers to think of themselves as club members sooner, improving overall retention. Our new members bring new excitement to our dances. Our special dances like the Halloween costume dance the last two years have been special fun, with innovative costumes, especially due to the new members.

Requirements: The club as a group and the vast majority of its members must agree to actively support the program, at least for two successive years. It means that they are not going to get much Plus dancing in, at most two or three tips out of eight called. It also means that they must all work to support the weekend program.

Advertising is a key. The first night of the class is the only night to start - if you don't have them there for the first session, you can't add them in later. Unlike traditionally formatted classes, you simply cannot keep the class open and extra week or two to pick up a few more students.

CALLERLAB PROGRAMS

BASIC and MAINSTREAM Why Programs and Lists?

CALLERLAB programs define a world-wide standard of square dance calls to be taught in square dance classes or workshops. Program lists, such as this one, list the set of calls that may be called at a dance advertised to be a specific dance program i.e. Basic, Mainstream, Plus, etc. Dance promoters are encouraged to list the program to be danced on flyers, brochures and other advertisements of open dances. Dancers should refer to the program designations to seek out dances that will consist of material with which they are familiar. Program lists are used by callers in programming an appropriate dance for a specific group of dancers. Including the desired program in the caller's confirmation agreement will provide programming guidance to the caller as well as protection for the sponsoring organization.

The program(s) are not intended to segregate dancers into exclusive groups or to indicate that one who chooses to dance at his or her own preferred program is any better, or any worse, than any other dancer. Dancing skill can be achieved at many programs, and the quantity of calls is not necessarily an indication of dancer proficiency. It is hoped that the program lists will be used to aid in a logical teaching progression and thorough coverage of basics in classes and to provide an enjoyable modern square dance for dancers of all inclinations. In addition, CALLERLAB's intent is that approved styling and timing of square dance movements will be an integral part of all classes and dance programs. It is also hoped that proper teaching, including timing and styling, will result in smooth dancing for the greater enjoyment of all.

What Next?

Responsible leaders, within and outside of CALLERLAB, recommend that dancers dance regularly at the program at which they graduate for at least one (1) year before they enter into classes or workshops for another program. This means that dancers graduating from the Mainstream Program should dance regularly at Mainstream dances for a year before going into the Plus Program.

There should be no pressure for movement from one program to another once a dancer has graduated. Dancers should be encouraged to take their time, enjoy the fun and fellowship and learn to dance well at that program before moving on to another program.

What About Periodic Selections?

Dancers are not required to know the Periodic Selections in order to attend an advertised Mainstream dance.

Periodic Selections are <u>not</u> part of the Basic and Mainstream Program. They are provided as optional material for those callers and/or clubs that wish to include a workshop in their programs. Callers are reminded that Periodic Selections should not be used unless they are walked through or workshopped first.
